Gleneagle Sertoma was chartered June 13, 1986, by Sertoma (SERvice TO MAnkind) Inc., an international service organization whose main focus is on hearing health issues. Locally, Sertoma Inc. Clubs support HEARS (Hearing Education and Assistance by Rocky Mountain Sertomans), the Soap Box Derby and the Sertoma Street Breakfast.

**WHAT:** *SERvice TO MAnkind*

Part of Sertoma's success stems from the autonomy of the individual clubs. Sertomans choose what projects are best for their own Club and community. Gleneagle Sertoma's main focus is directed toward Colorado Springs and the Tri-Lakes area.

Gleneagle Sertoma Club contributed over \$14,000 to charitable causes in 2007. Major beneficiaries include HEARS, Disability Services of Colorado, local Goodwill Industries, Boy Scout Troop 174, Pine Creek and Classical Academy Sertean Club, Pikes Peak Hospice, and Salvation Army. In the past five years, contributions have exceeded \$75,000.

Each year, for Parent's Day and Graduation weekends at the Air Force Academy, members of the club open their homes as Bed & Breakfasts for



cadet parents. This is one of the club's biggest fundraisers.

In the spring, the club puts on the Spirits of Spring Wine and Beer Tasting, featuring local distributors, that includes a silent and live auction.

Gleneagle hosts a Patriot's Day Golf Benefit, on September 11th, combining fun with recognition of local police, fire and military members who are provided a free admission to the event. Other smaller fundraisers are held during the year.

In addition to fundraising, the club is involved in several hands-on projects. Colorado Cares, the Boy Scouts' Camp Alexander and the Fox Run Regional Park are have been beneficiaries of our efforts. Recently, the club has joined hands with the Western Museum of Mining and Industry to complete some fix-up and clean-up projects. The club also hosts two blood drives in conjunction with Penrose St. Francis.



Sertomans throughout the country foster national pride through a National Heritage program that



provides local junior high school students with copies of the Bill of Rights and Declaration of Independence. Students also participate in a city-wide essay contest, with winners being recognized at a banquet.

Gleneagle Sertoma has formed a relationship with the Rampart Range Campus of Pikes Peak Community College. The club's goal is to provide grants to assist the College in providing specialized equipment for hearing impaired students. The club also helps fund scholarships for hearing impaired students.

Not one to foster an all work and no play atmosphere, the club membership gathers several times a year for picnics, Super Bowl parties, Christmas dinner and other socials.

Sertoma can provide deep satisfaction from serving others voluntarily. It is a chance to fulfill that sense of responsibility that some feel toward society as a whole and toward less fortunate individuals in particular. It provides an opportunity to share in the growth of the community and to have fellowship with some of the community's finest citizens.

Sertoma provides business networking opportunities, personal growth and development, leaderships skills



and the chance to build lifelong friendships.

New members pay a one time initiation fee of \$25.00. Club quarterly dues of \$33.25 include Club, District, Region and Sertoma, Inc. dues. The cost for lunch is extra.
